## WHO ARE WE?

Academic Learning Advisers (ALAs) have a range of qualifications, and teaching experiences that enable them to provide feedback and develop resources on many concepts and skills. Enjoy the relaxed environment of our Academic Learning Centres while getting the best advice from our very knowledgeable team.

## WHAT DO WE DO?

 **ALC—Academic Communication** can help you with academic writing, speaking and referencing using a range of resources including information sheets, videos, activity sheets and answer sheets.

 **ALC—Computing** can help you with formatting and other technological challenges encountered in your study. Resources include templates, videos and information sheets.

 **ALC—Mathematics and Statistics** gives you access to a Moodle site especially designed to help you refresh or develop your knowledge on maths concepts required for a range of courses. You can take quizzes and work through content at your own pace, or make an appointment for one-on-one support.

 **ALC—Science** offers you advice and assistance on science assignments and research. Preparatory modules can help update your scientific skills in biology, chemistry, botany and physics. Also, benefit from advice on how to study science subjects.

## ALC SERVICES

**Get a helping hand with your studies by contacting the ALC and benefit from:**

- » one hour per week, no cost, one-on-one consultations to assist you with your transition to university
- » on campus workshops held during term and at orientation, open to everyone—look out for notices on campus, in your inbox and on UCROO
- » a personalised online service delivered using tools such as ZOOM
- » the convenience of online forms to submit a 'quick query' or submit an assignment
- » a huge range of tools, tips and guides available on the ALC Moodle site any time you need them
- » extra support for distance students—take advantage of online consultations with an adviser or if you're travelling long distances to a campus you may be offered a longer appointment, and may get to see several advisers.
