

## Central Queensland University 2008 Tuition Fee Schedule

The 2008 Tuition Fee Schedule is effective from 1/1/2008 and replaces all Schedules previously issued. Tuition Fees are reviewed annually and whenever possible published on 1<sup>st</sup> October each year for the following year.

**Tuition Fees for each course of enrolment are calculated per unit of credit.** Except where otherwise indicated, examples of “Fee per Course” in the Schedule assume that fees are calculated for:

- a standard UNDERGRADUATE course of 6 units of credit; or
- a standard POSTGRADUATE course of 8 units of credit.

However, courses may have a unit of credit value different to the standard value – please check the Student Handbook for information on units of credit per course. Fees applicable to domestic students for each course offered by CQU are also published in the Cost per Course table at
